Certainly, the correct choice is to get the correct word to fit in the spaces provided with all letters in the blocks.

We have inserted the **completed** crossword puzzle that your CCD class developed with those few blanks you have asked for some assistance. Those answers are in the RED color in both the Across and Down directions. I have also highlighted in Yellow those questions printed at the bottom of the crossword puzzle.

Here are a few comments regarding some of the answers you requested:

#### **ACROSS**

#### #14: VEIL

The Veil (or curtain) symbolized the separation of God and man. The tearing of the veil in the temple was significant not only because it happened but also in the way it happened. God tore the curtain, from top to bottom, in two pieces. God made a way for us through Jesus, and so He tore the veil that separated us from Him.

#### **DOWN**

#### #2: CROWDS

Jesus was mocked, laughed at and objects thrown at Him many times after His trial, when carrying the cross and His crucifixion by both the Roman soldiers, those in the crowds watching and by people passing as He was hanging on the cross.

#### **#10: CONVENANT**

Jesus' death opened a New Covenant between GOD and the His people. His death defeated the power of Satan. He disarmed the rulers and authorities and put them to open **shame**, by triumphing over them in him (Colossians 2:15).

## **#16: APOSTLES**

John was the only one of the Apostles who was present with Mary at the Jesus crucifixion and may have helped take Jesus down from the cross. Additionally, Nicodemus and Joseph of Arimathea obtained a ladder and helped remove Jesus from the cross.
